Education, and especially young riders' education, is an important part of the Green Education Strategy proposed by the FIM Europe Environment Commission since 10 years.

The sustainable development in motorcycle sport is important for the future of motorsport.

The FIM Europe Commission recommends the environmental education during motorsport events and training camps.

Approach young riders in a playful way and highlight themes such as:

- 1. Sorting waste into marked containers
- 2. Not using single-use plastics
- 3. Using of environmental mats under motorcycles and petrol generators in the paddock
- 4. Washing motorcycles without chemicals and only in a designated area
- 5. Leaving used oil, brake fluid, filters, rags belong in marked waste containers
- 6. Familiarizing yourself with the environmental management map placed in a visible place of the venue
- 7. Protecting the environment, don't leave litter behind, don't build open fires, don't dump caravan waste water on the road when leaving the paddock

Young riders should know that there is an active "Environmental Steward" at every event who can advise and help!
